 - Pages 1–6 show full princess images split into top and bottom halves
 - Pages 7–12 increase complexity with four-piece puzzles requiring more precise matching

1. Print on cardstock for durability
2. Laminate for long-term use
3. Cut along the puzzle lines (2-piece or 4-piece sets)
4. Mix pieces or keep sets separate depending on learner level

PRINCESS VISUAL DISCRIMINATION PUZZLES

Instructions for Engagement:

Core Activity: Complete the Princess Puzzle

- Learners select puzzle pieces and:
 - Observe the visual details (colors, shapes, features)
 - Find the matching pieces
 - Assemble the pieces to complete the princess image
- Encourage learners to use visual clues such as color, shape, and position to guide their matching.

Classroom Centre Ideas!

- **Fine Motor / Puzzle Centre** - Place mixed puzzle pieces in a bin for independent assembly
- **Small Group Table** - Guide learners in noticing visual details and matching correctly
- **Visual Discrimination Centre** - Use as a targeted activity for learners developing visual processing skills
- **Morning Tub Activity** - Engaging and calm start-of-day puzzle work

Variations and Extensions

1. **Match and Describe** - Learners describe the princess (colors, dress, crown) after completing
2. **Memory Match** - Turn pieces face down and match using memory
3. **Puzzle Challenge** - Mix multiple puzzles together for increased difficulty
4. **Create Your Own** - Learners draw and cut their own simple puzzle

Differentiation

Beginning Learners

- Use 2-piece puzzles only
- Provide one puzzle at a time

Developing Learners

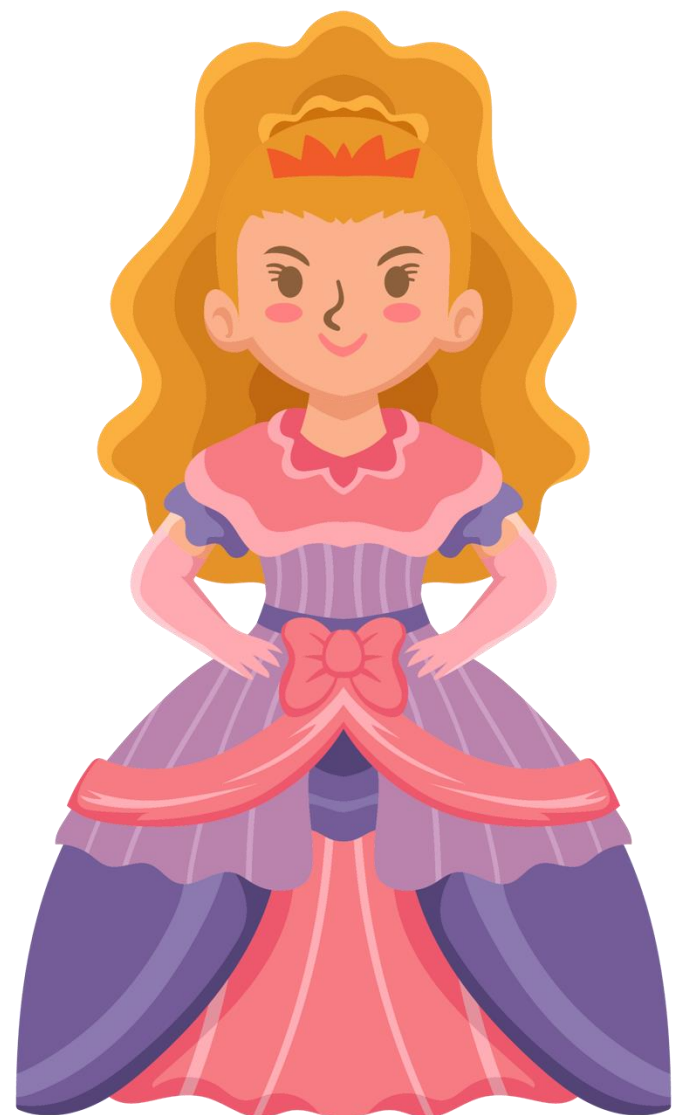
- Introduce mixed 2-piece sets

Advanced Learners

- Use 4-piece puzzles mixed together
- Encourage learners to explain their reasoning

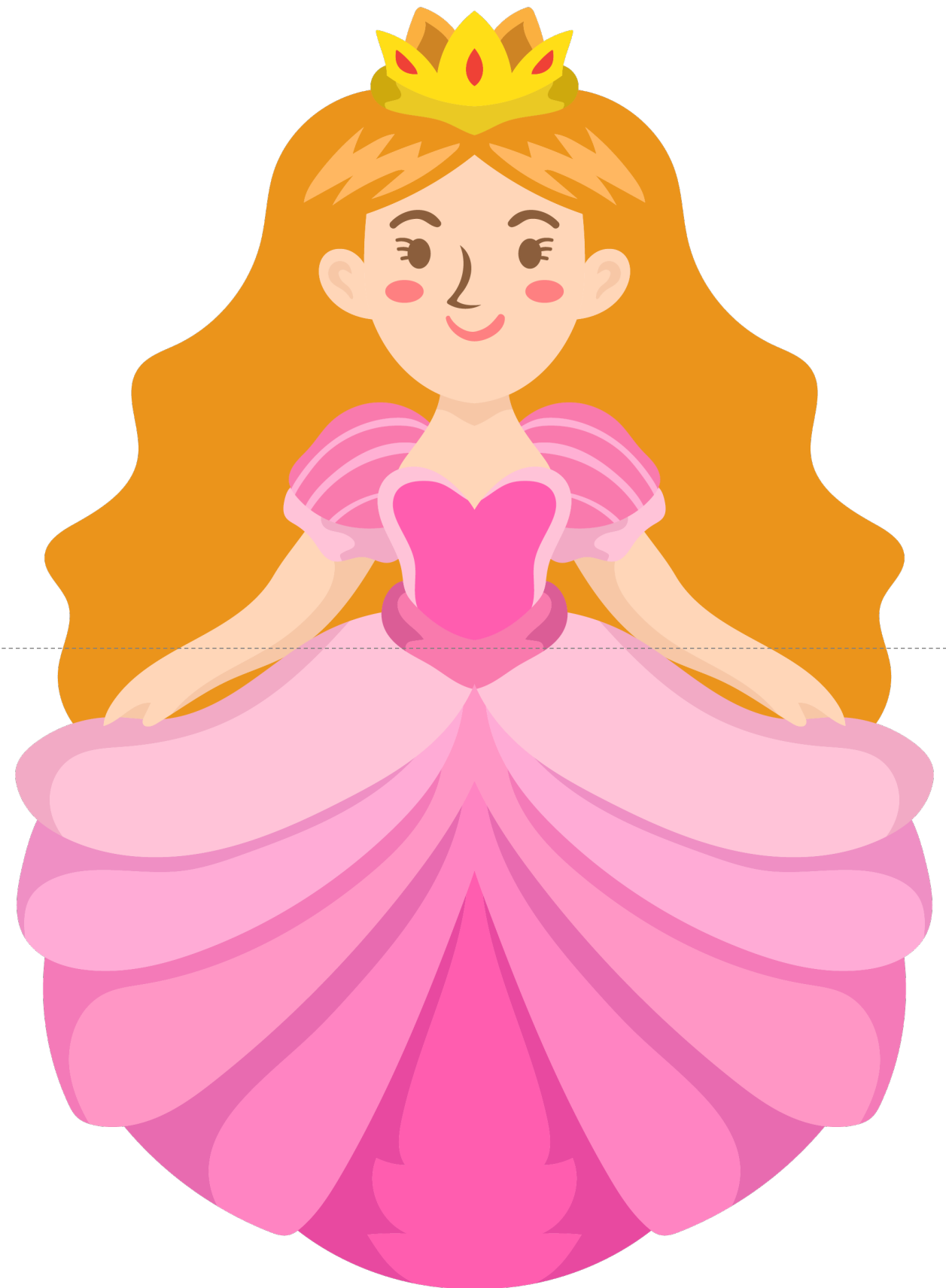
Teacher Talk Prompts

- "Can you describe the princess?"





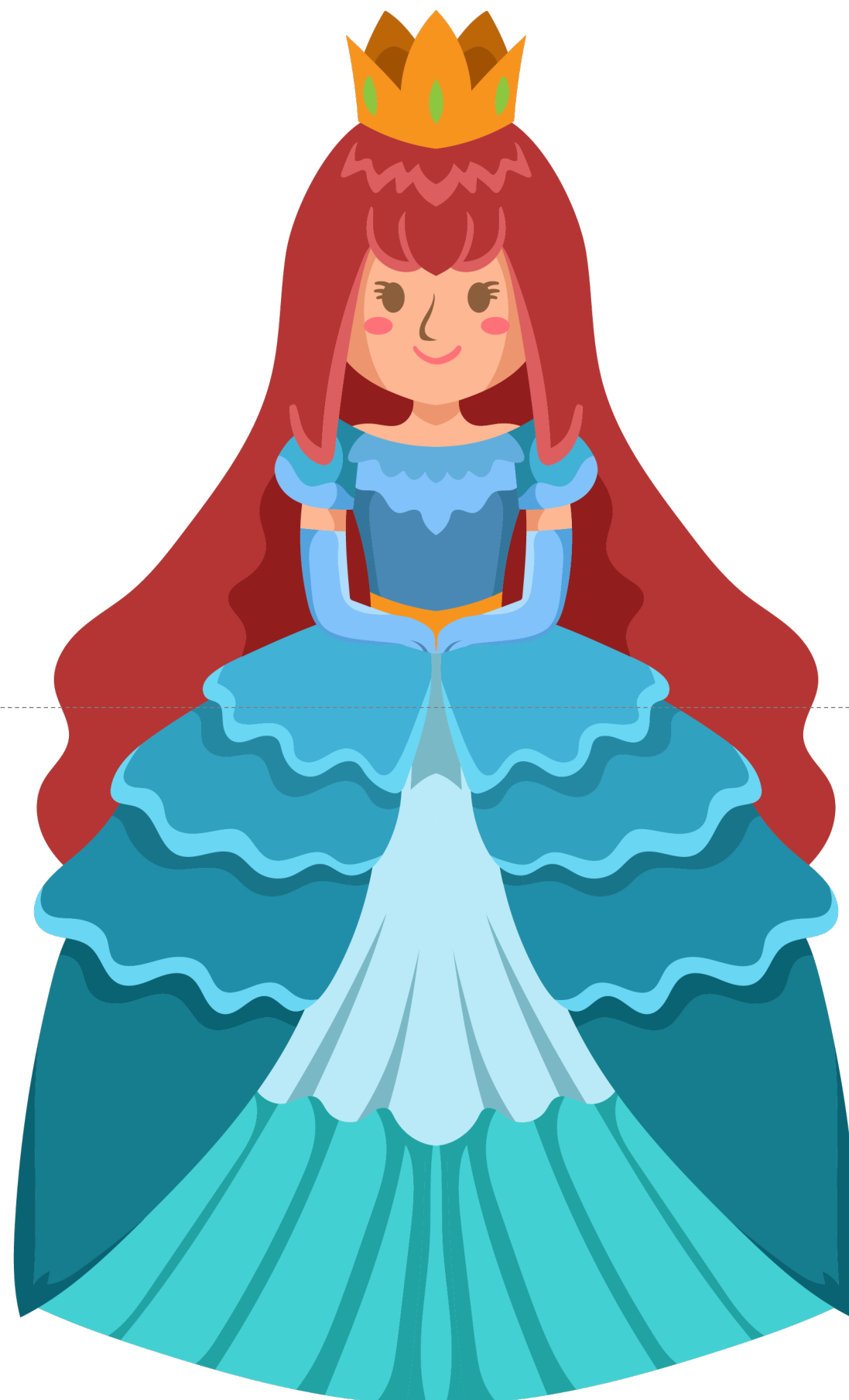
